The first panel shows the blot for ab3462 (pan- $\hat{1}\pm 1$) tested with heart tissue from a WT mouse and a mouse with genetic deletion of $\hat{1}\pm 1$ -AR subtypes: one (AKO, RRID:IMSR_JAX:005039), two (ABKO), or all three (ABDKO). Size markers are shown at far left and the 54 kDa marker is indicated on each blot.
